Friday 8th May sees the 75th Anniversary of VE day. VE day marks the day in which the Allied forces accepted the unconditional surrender of Nazi Germany and the wider Nazi Party marking the end of WW2. If we were in school we would have marked this event in history with activities across the week, therefore this week's home-learning activities will be based upon VE day and the events of WW2.
